CoinFlip is a direct player-vs-player (PvP) game mode. 2 gamers wager skins of roughly equivalent monetary worth. A virtual coin is turned, and the winner takes the entire pot, minus a small commission (house edge) taken by the site.

4. Prize

In a Jackpot video game, numerous gamers toss skins into a central pot. Each skin adds to the player's total portion possibility of winning the entire pot (based on the dollar worth of their contribution). A virtual spinner chooses a winning ticket, and one lucky gamer takes home all the deposited skins.
