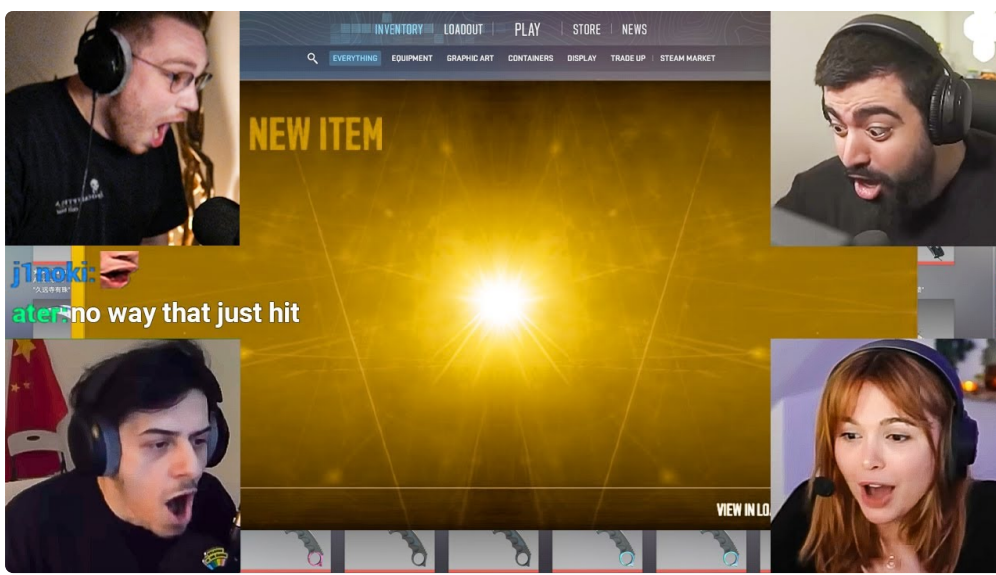
Methods to Improve Your Case Battle Experience
