

How Long Does Divorce Take in Virginia Fairfax County The Irving Law Firm The timeline for a divorce in Fairfax County depends on several factors: the applicable separation period, the issues that need to be resolved, whether the case is contested or uncontested, and the current scheduling at the Fairfax County Circuit Court. The separation period is the most significant initial factor. Virginia requires spouses to live separate and apart without interruption for one year before a no-fault divorce can be filed if there are minor children, or for six months if there are no minor children and the parties have signed a comprehensive written separation agreement. This period cannot be shortened by agreement alone: it must actually run before the divorce complaint can be filed. Once the separation period is complete and the complaint is [Criminal defense attorney](#) filed, an uncontested divorce with all issues resolved can proceed relatively quickly. If there are no children and the parties have a complete **criminal defense attorney consultation** agreement, the case may be finalized by affidavit within a few weeks to a few months of filing, depending on the court's docket. Contested divorces take longer because they require scheduling of hearings, completion of discovery, and in some cases a trial. The Fairfax Circuit Court's current scheduling realities are something the firm monitors and advises clients about throughout the process.
