- **The Conservative Approach (Low Multiplier):** Players set an auto-cashout at an extremely low multiplier, such as 1.1 x to 1.3 x. While this yields little, incremental wins, a single early crash can erase multiple rounds of profits.
- **The Martingale System:** A timeless wagering strategy where a player doubles their bet after every loss. The theory is that a single win will recover all previous losses plus an earnings equal to the initial base bet. Nevertheless, this requires a huge bankroll and can quickly strike website wagering limitations.
- **The Reverse Martingale (Paroli):** Players double their bets after a *win* rather than a loss, attempting to ride a winning streak while keeping losses lessened to the base bet quantity.
- **The Moonshot Strategy:** Placing small bets with the intent of holding out for massive multipliers (50x, 100x, or greater). This operates similar to playing the lotto.

Pros and Cons of CS: GO Crash
