### The Weekly Drop System

Every week, active-duty players who level up their profile receive a care plan where they can choose two rewards out of 4 choices, which sometimes includes a weapon case. In addition, gamers can get random drops at the end of matches on main servers.

### Active Service vs. Rare Drop Pools

Valve classifies cases into two primary swimming pools:

- **Active Drop Pool:** These cases drop regularly to gamers currently playing the game. They normally represent the most recently launched collections.
- **Unusual (Discontinued) Drop Pool:** These older cases no longer drop routinely after matches. Rather, they have an infinitesimally small possibility of dropping (roughly a 1% opportunity compared to active drops), triggering their market worth to value over time.
