

Is it safe to take out a nest of wasps yourself?

In some cases, a small **wasp nest** may seem manageable, but safe removal is not just about size. The actual hazard comes from **working wasps** defending the colony, especially when the nest is disturbed. **Biting insects** can move fast, and a few seconds of hesitation can turn into a simple job into a painful incident.

On detached and semi-detached houses, look around around rooflines, porch ceilings, and back decks. On townhouses, side alleys, shared soffits, and rear walkouts are frequent trouble spots.
