



Average Garage Door repair Cost in Los Angeles

The average **garage door repair cost** in Los Angeles is approximately \$150 to \$600 for a typical repair. Minor adjustments, lubrication, or sensor alignment may cost less, while a broken spring, damaged panel, failed opener, or bent track can cost significantly more. A major repair involving several replacement parts may approach \$1,000 or more.

Garage Door Spring Replacement Cost

The **cost of a garage door spring** is generally \$200 to \$500 for replacement of one or two springs, including typical spring replacement labor. A **torsion-type spring** is installed above the door and is common on modern residential systems. An **extension-type spring** is positioned along the horizontal tracks and may require additional safety hardware.

Spring prices vary depending on the door's weight, spring cycle rating, number of springs, and availability of replacement parts. A heavier wood or insulated door may require stronger springs than a lightweight single-car door. Garage Door Panel Repair or Replacement Cost

A **garage door panel** may be repaired when the damage is slight, but dents, cracks, warping, or structural separation often require panel replacement. A small repair may cost approximately \$150–\$350. Replacing one panel commonly costs \$300–\$900, while a custom, oversized, wood-look, or heavily insulated panel can cost more.

Panel replacement is usually easier on a **sectional garage door** because individual sections can be removed. Garage Door Opener Repair and Installation Cost

Repairing a **garage door opener** typically costs about \$150–\$400. Common problems include worn gears, a failed circuit board, damaged sensors, a broken chain, remote-control issues, or a motor that has stopped working. If the opener is old or has suffered repeated failures, replacement may provide a more economical option than another repair.
