The Five Wear Categories

When a weapon surface is dropped or unboxed, it is designated a particular **Float Value** varying from 0.00 to 1.00. This float figures out how scratched, worn, or faded the texture appears in-game.

Wear Category Float Value Range In-Game Appearance **Factory New (FN)** 0.00-- 0.07 Pristine, minimal to no scratches or acnes. **Very Little Wear (MW)** 0.07-- 0.15 Really slight wear, generally visible on close inspection. **Field-Tested (FT)** 0.15-- 0.38 Visible scratches and use on prominent edges. **Well-Worn (WW)** 0.38-- 0.45 Significant wear, paint fading, and popular scratches. **Battle-Scarred (BS)** 0.45-- 1.00 Greatly distressed, rusted, or significantly faded textures.

(Note: Certain products actually look much better or end up being preferred in greater wear conditions-- such as the "AWP|Asiimov"-- while others require a beautiful Factory New condition to command high prices.)

Rarity Tiers

Weapon surfaces are additionally classified by color-coded rarity tiers, which dictate how regularly they appear in cases and trade-ups:

- **Consumer Grade/ Industrial Grade (White/Light Blue):** Common, low-tier products often utilized for standard trade-ups.
- **Mil-Spec (Dark Blue):** Standard drop-tier products.
- **Restricted (Purple):** Uncommon, desirable mid-tier surfaces.
- **Categorized (Pink):** Rare and striking designs often central to collections.
- **Covert (Red):** The greatest standard weapon tier, featuring iconic styles like the Redline or Fire Serpent.
- **Unique/ Extraordinarily Rare (Gold):** Knives and Gloves. These are the crown jewels of the market.

The Economy: Trading, Markets, and Value

The digital economy surrounding these products is completely player-driven. Valve sets the standard through official in-game case drops and the Steam Community Market, but a massive external ecosystem exists through third-party trading sites, peer-to-peer marketplaces, and **CS2 Gambling Site** community online forums.



Aspects That Influence Price

1. **Supply and Demand:** Items from older, discontinued cases are rarer, increasing their market value.
2. **Float and Pattern Templates:** Some products include particular pattern indexes that change the visual look totally (e.g., the "Case Hardened" pattern, where blue quantities determine extreme value).
3. **Sticker labels and StatTrak:** Applying rare, discontinued competition sticker labels can increase an item's worth. StatTrak technology, which tracks the number of eliminates a gamer gets with a particular weapon, also commands a price premium.
4. **Pro-Player Association:** When a professional esports gamer uses a specific weapon finish during a significant competition, demand for that product typically increases overnight.

Additionally, the shift to the Source 2 engine brought enormous visual improvements:

- **Lighting and Reflections:** Metallic surfaces now catch light dynamically, making gold and chrome products look terribly reasonable.
- **Geometry Changes:** Many designs were subtly remodeled, permitting surfaces to twist around the weapons with higher fidelity and better texturing than ever in the past.

- **Check Animations:** Inspecting items ended up being a mesmerizing experience due to enhanced physics and lighting interactions.

Tips for Beginners Entering the Market
