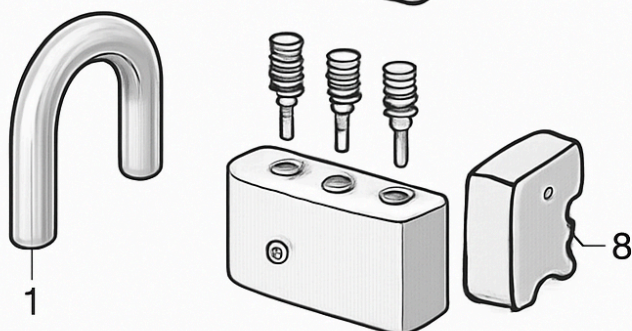
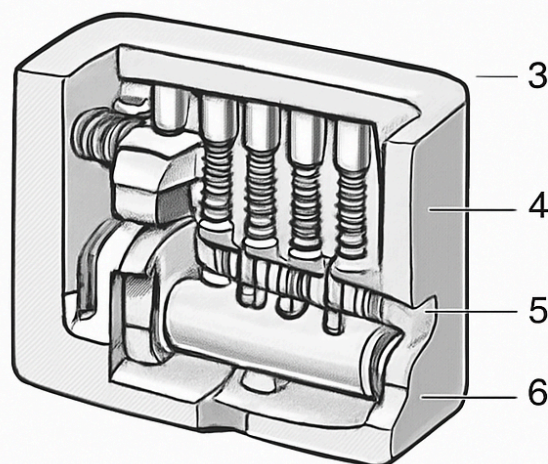
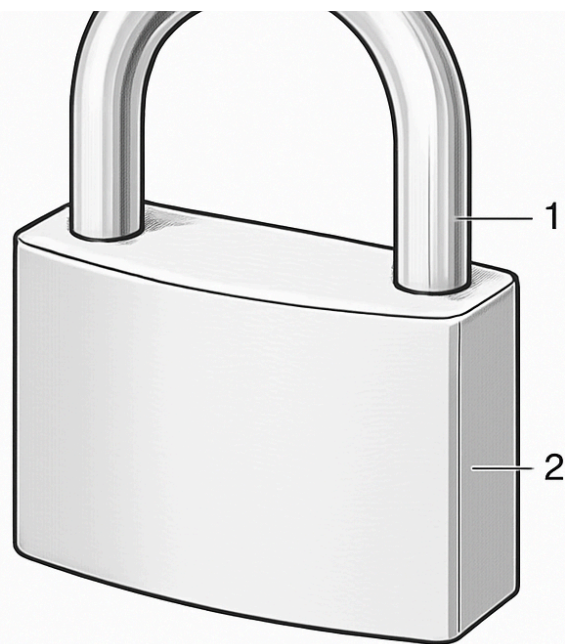
Commercial locksmith Orlando for storefronts, offices, and access control
