The rarity directly affects price: the rarer the tier, the higher the prospective value, particularly for items in the "Covert" or "Rare Special Item" categories.

How Players Obtain Skins

There are numerous paths to get skins, each with its own benefits:

1. **Opening Cases**-- Players purchase secrets to open weapon cases. The probability of acquiring a high-value skin is low, however the chance of a "Covert" or "Knife" makes the gamble appealing.
2. **Market Purchases**-- The Steam Community Market (SCM) provides immediate ownership. Third-party sites (e.g., SkinBaron, CSGOstash) often list prices below SCM's fees.
3. **Trade-Up Contracts**-- By combining 10 items of the very same rarity (omitting knives), players can receive a single product of the next rarity tier. This system is popular for approaching higher-value skins.
4. **Battle-Pass or Operation Rewards**-- Certain operations (e.g., "Operation Broken Fang") award exclusive skins upon completing missions.
5. **Direct Purchase from Other Players**-- Using Steam's trade-offer system, gamers can buy or sell skins straight, frequently at worked out rates.

Understanding the Skin Economy

The skin market behaves like any other secondary market: supply, need, and rarity drive rates. Secret aspects that influence evaluation include:

- **Rarity & Float-- Factory New (low float) products command a premium.**
- **Pattern/Seed--** Certain weapon patterns (e.g., "Doppler" stages) are preferred.
- **Sticker labels--** Popular competition sticker labels, specifically those from significant occasions, can add substantial worth.
