- A narrow shovel or trenching shovel for mindful digging
- Work gloves and marked flags or landscape paint
- A flashlight and, if available, a basic pipes cleanout map or building sketch

Push the probe right into the dirt with constant stress. If the ground is bone dry, the job can be stubborn. A day after light rain is often perfect since the probe slides much more easily through the soil without ending up being a sloppy mess. When you hit resistance, do not think you located the tank on the very first poke. Probe around that point.
