

A broken garage door spring can leave your vehicle trapped inside, prevent secure access to your home, and put additional stress on the garage door opener. In Los Angeles, homeowners often seek reliable garage door repair after experiencing a sharp popping noise or discovering that the garage door will not open. A failed spring is a common cause, but the problem may also involve a garage door cable, rollers, door tracks, or the opener itself.

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## Ways to Recognize When a Garage Door Spring Is Broken

The clearest sign of a broken garage door spring is a garage door that becomes very hard to lift. You may hear a sudden loud pop as the spring breaks, although some failures happen without much noise. If the garage door will not open with the wall button or remote, check whether the opener motor is operating properly and whether the door itself feels heavier than normal.

Typical broken garage door spring symptoms include:



- The garage door is stuck in the closed or partially open position.

- The door feels weighty when you try to lift it manually
- The door rises a few inches and then will not continue.
- One side of the door appears closer to the ground than the other, creating an uneven garage door.
- A visible gap can be seen in the spring.
- A garage door cable has detached or is hanging beside the door.
- The opener runs, but the door does not operate properly.

Most residential doors use either a torsion spring or extension springs. A **torsion spring** is mounted across the width of the garage above the closed door and uses stored twisting force to lift the door. An **extension spring** is positioned along the horizontal tracks and stretches as the door moves. Extension spring systems should be equipped with a safety cable because a failed spring can move violently through the garage.

A broken spring can also make a fully operational garage door opener appear defective. The opener is designed to direct and control the door, not carry the full garage door weight. Continuing to operate the opener when the spring has failed may damage its drive components, drive system, or mounting hardware.

## Reasons Damaged Garage Door Springs Require Professional Repair

Garage door springs hold significant mechanical energy. Even after a spring seems broken, the leftover parts of the system may still contain dangerous **spring tension**. Removing, winding, or installing a spring without the right tools and training can cause serious injury to hands, arms, face, or other parts of the body.

The **weight of the garage door** also creates a serious hazard. A residential door may weigh hundreds of pounds, and the spring system is responsible for balancing that load. If a cable slips, a bracket fails, or the door is inadequately supported, the door can fall unexpectedly. Do not attempt to manually open a garage door that is stuck or disconnect the opener without understanding how to stabilize the door.

A qualified **garage door technician** can identify whether the failure involves the spring, cable drums, rollers, hinges, tracks, or another component. The technician can also confirm that the **protective cables** are correctly installed on extension spring systems. These cables pass through the springs and help limit movement if a spring breaks.

For safety, avoid standing beneath a partially open door, pulling on a loose garage door cable, or using makeshift tools to wind a torsion spring. Keep children and pets away from the area and disconnect the opener only when the door is properly secured and a professional instructs you to do so.

## Garage Door Spring Renewal Process

Expert garage door spring replacement begins with a complete **spring inspection**. The technician checks the failed spring, spring brackets, bearing plates, cables, drums, rollers, hinges, tracks, and opener connection. This inspection reveals whether the spring failed because of ordinary wear or whether another issue, such as corrosion, binding, or poor door balance, caused the problem.

The technician then selects the proper **replacement spring**. Springs are selected based on the garage door's size, weight, height, lift configuration, and existing hardware. A spring that is too weak will not properly counterbalance the door, while an incorrectly strong spring can create unsafe operating forces and premature wear.

For a torsion spring system, the technician properly secures the door, releases the remaining tension with professional winding tools, removes the damaged components, and installs the correctly sized spring. With

After installation, the technician performs a **garage door balance test**. The door should remain near the middle of its travel when lifted manually and should move smoothly without dropping, drifting upward, or becoming unusually heavy. Lubrication is another essential step. Hinges, rollers, bearings, and other moving points may require the correct garage door lubricant. Lubrication should not be used to conceal worn components, but it can limit friction and support preventive maintenance. In Los Angeles, the generally mild, dry climate means seasonal temperature extremes may be less severe than in colder regions, but garage doors still need periodic inspection and lubrication.

Homes near the Los Angeles coast, including Santa Monica, Venice, and Long Beach, may be exposed to salt-laden air and higher humidity. Over time, these conditions can lead to corrosion on exposed metal hardware, cables, springs, brackets, and fasteners. A regular garage door inspection can identify corrosion before it becomes a larger performance issue.
