A reasonable path: relocating from "can teach" to "can examine"

When you initially come to be a teacher, you commonly feel like you're finding out to educate. As training continues, you change right into a more requiring frame of mind: you become in charge of evaluating. That's a various ability set.

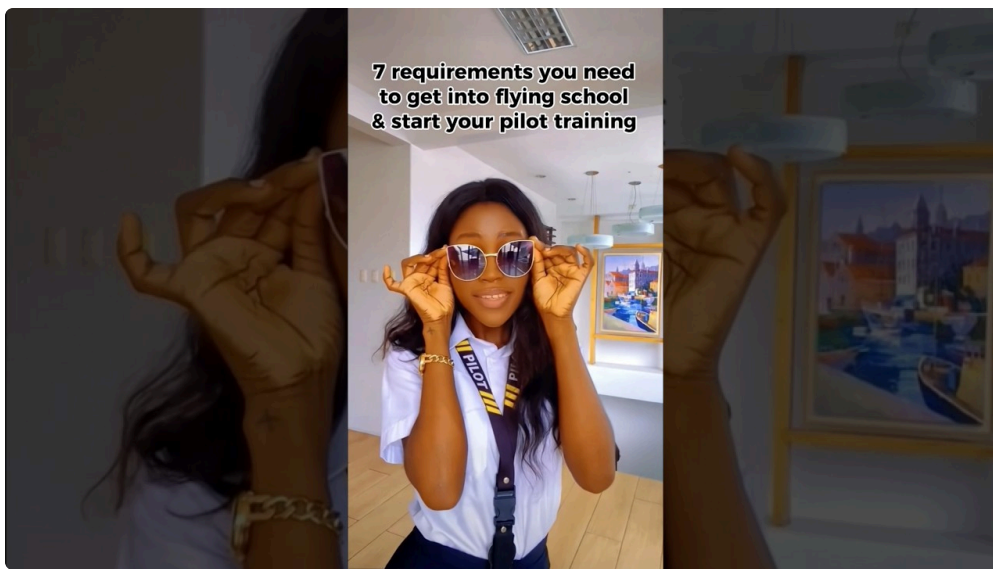
1. They right as well rapidly and too often, turning discovering right into a constant interruption.
2. They right too late, letting mistakes calcify into practices the trainee after that needs to unlearn.

There's additionally the psychological compromise between training and safeguarding.
