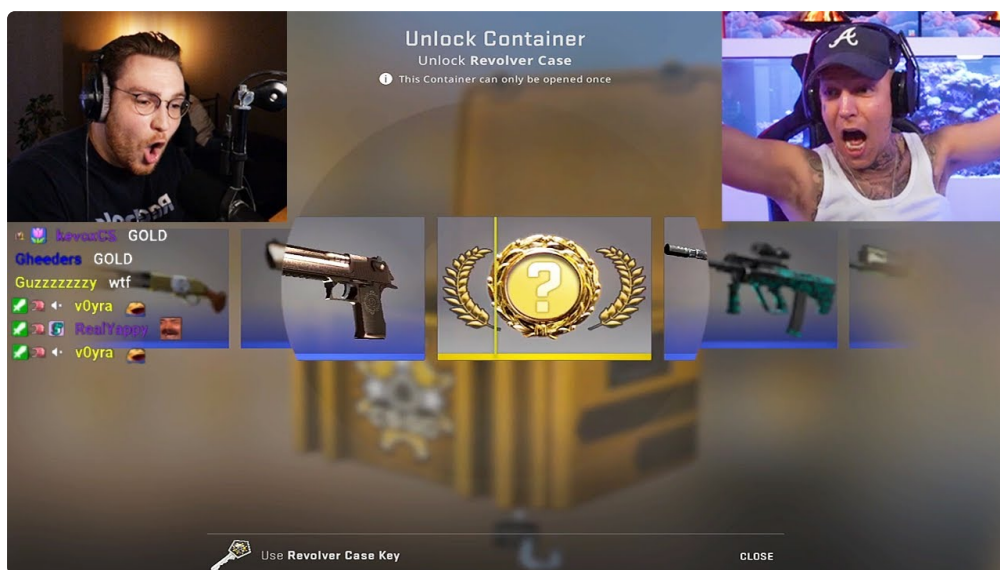
Key Features of Modern Case Battle Platforms
