- **Step 5: Setting the Glass:** A thin bed of glazing putty is put down, the brand-new glass is pushed carefully into place, and glazier's points are driven in to secure it.
- **Action 6: Applying the Final Seal:** A neat triangle of putty is applied around the boundary of the glass, smoothed out, and delegated treat before painting.
