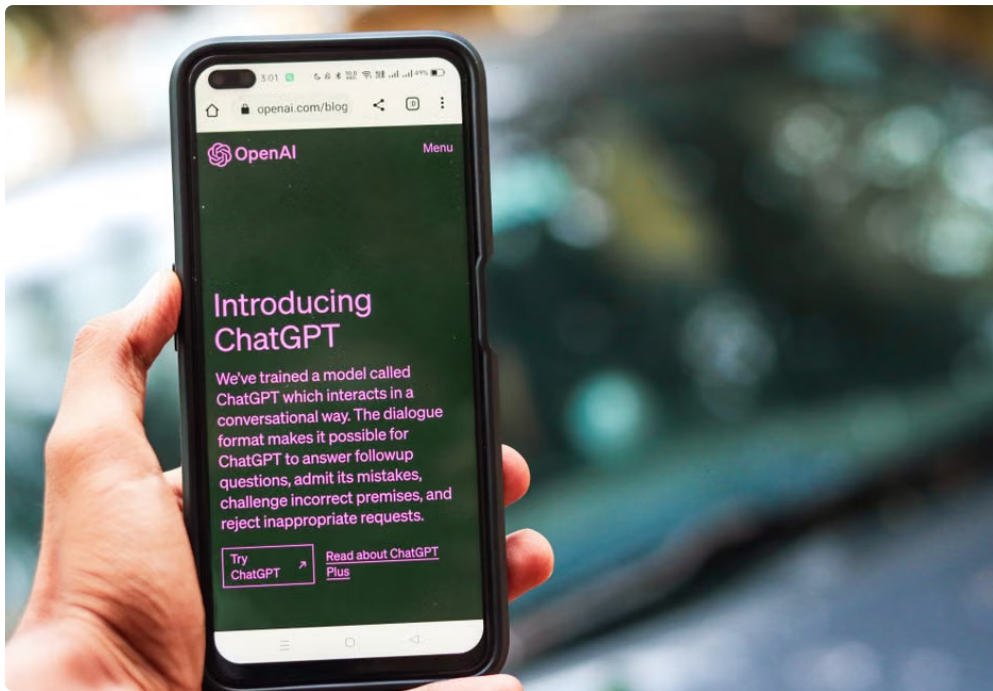

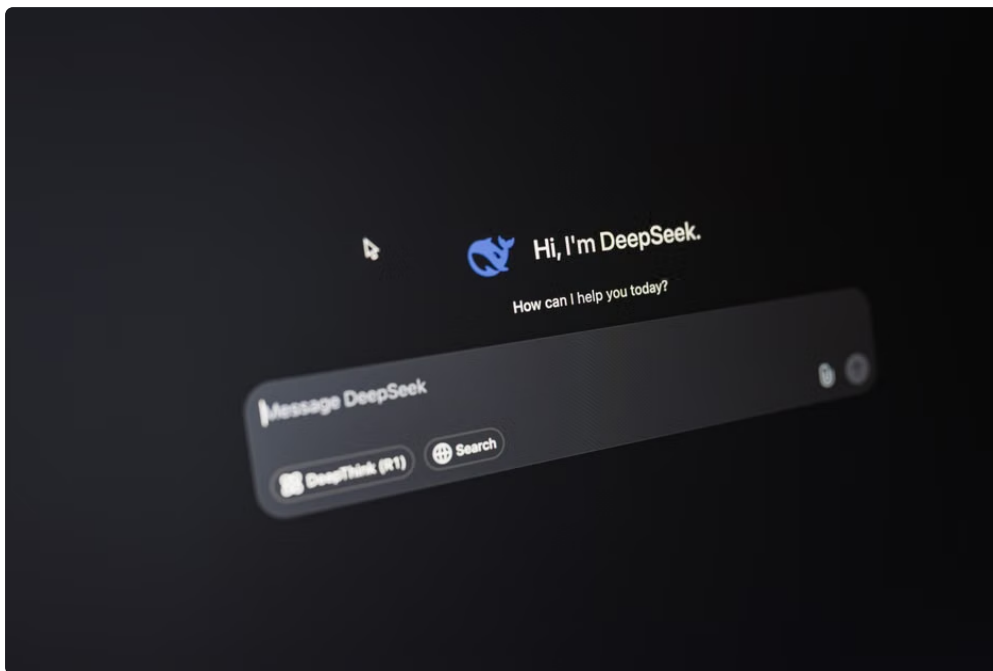

New users or those accustomed to single-model chatbots may find the interface and interaction model initially daunting. ### 3. Vendors Implied but Did Not Say: API Access for Integration
