- **Pack Your Steamer Before Your Shoes.** Shoes can be heavy—packing your fabric steamer or travel-sized steamer separately and accessibly should be done early so you can freshen the suit as needed.
- **Bring Backup Hangers.** Hotel hangers are often wire and thin. Your *Von Baer Grand Leather Garment Bag* usually includes solid wood or thick plastic ones, but pack an extra if not.
