- **Coinflip:** A direct player-versus-player (PvP) video game where 2 users bet skins of equivalent worth on a digital coin turn. Winner takes all.
- **Jackpot:** Multiple gamers discard skins into a typical pot. A timer counts down, and a random skin is picked; the greater the worth of a gamer's contribution, the greater their statistical opportunity of winning the entire pot.

Contrast of CS2 Gambling vs. Traditional Casinos
