- **Prize:** Multiple gamers pool their skins into a main pot. A random draw identifies a single winner who takes the whole pot, with winning chances proportional to the worth of the skins deposited.
- **Plinko:** Dropping a ball down a pegged board to land in multipliers at the bottom.

Comparing Traditional Casinos vs. CS2 Gambling Sites

How Transactions Work: Steam API and P2P Trading

In the past, CS2 gambling sites used bots that straight traded with players via Steam accounts. Nevertheless, Valve has cracked down on automated trading bots for many years by carrying out trade lock durations (items traded can not be re-traded for 7 days) and upgrading API security.

Today, many platforms utilize **Peer-to-Peer (P2P) systems**.

1. When a player desires to deposit, the site sets them with another gamer looking to cash out.
2. The transferring player sends out the skin directly to the buyer through a safe Steam trade link.
3. The site credits the depositor's account balance once the trade is validated.

This technique assists platforms prevent direct participation in handling Valve's stock items while keeping the virtual economy flowing.

Risks Associated with CS2 Gambling

- **Usage Two-Factor Authentication (2FA):** Secure your Steam Guard mobile authenticator and email accounts carefully.
