- **Pattern Index:** A seed number (from 1 to 1000) that determines how a texture is mapped onto a weapon. For specific skins, a particular pattern can place an uncommon design aspect-- like blue on a Case Hardened knife-- in prime presence.
- **StatTrak™ Technology:** An optional counter developed into the weapon that digitally tape-records the variety of eliminates the owner accomplishes with it.
- **Memento Quality:** Items dropped solely throughout official Valve-sponsored esports tournaments (Majors), featuring gold sticker labels honoring the match and teams.

The Wear Rating Hierarchy

Comprehending skin wear is important for anyone wanting to buy, sell, or trade. The wear condition is divided into 5 unique categories:

Exterior Condition Float Value Range Visual Description **Factory New (FN)** 0.00-- 0.07 Beautiful condition with minimal to no scratches or blemishes. **Very Little Wear (MW)** 0.07-- 0.15 Really light wear, normally little scratches visible just upon close inspection. **Field-Tested (FEET)** 0.15-- 0.38 Obvious wear and tear, scratches on the body and paint chipping on edges. **Well-Worn (WW)** 0.38-- 0.45 Substantial wear, heavy scratching, and visible fading of colors. **Battle-Scarred (BS)** 0.45-- 1.00 Incredibly worn, greatly faded, rusted, or scraped appearance.

Keep in mind: Some skins are "capped," suggesting they can not physically drop in Factory New condition because of how the texture is programmed.

The Economics of the CS2 Marketplace

What separates Counter-Strike from a lot of other computer game is its open, player-driven economy. Valve created a virtual ecosystem where digital products hold real-world value, sustained by the Steam Community Market and third-party trading platforms.

Aspects Driving Skin Prices:

1. **Rarity and Drop Rates:** Just like physical trading cards, the chances of unboxing unusual items (like Covert rifles, knives, or gloves) from weapon cases are extremely low.
2. **Supply and Demand:** If a particular case is no longer dropping in-game, the supply of its included skins ends up being limited, typically causing costs to increase gradually.
3. **Expert Play (Esports):** When a professional gamer utilizes a specific skin during a major tournament, need for that product typically increases overnight.
4. **Trade-Ups:** Players can trade up 10 skins of one rarity tier for one skin of the next higher tier, completely taking in the input products and changing market materials.
