1. The AWP|Dragon Lore

Possibly the most famous skin in the game, the Dragon Lore includes a legendary dragon breathing fire across the body of the sniper rifle. Originally dropped specifically on specific maps like Cobblestone during significant competitions, these souvenir plans are now exceedingly unusual. A Factory New Souvenir Dragon Lore signed by super star player Skaddoodle notoriously sold for over £ 60,000 [click here](#) years earlier, and rates have actually just intensified given that.

2. The AK-47|Case Hardened (Pattern 661 "Blue Gem")
