- Craftsman and cottage designs prefer square proportions. Meadow grids with a heavier perimeter and lighter interior lines match these homes. Seeded or frosted glass keeps the charm while securing privacy.
- Mid-century and contemporary homes can pull off full-view aluminum doors or large, frameless-looking lites. If your home has black window frameworks, match it with black or bronze garage window frameworks for a natural band of color.
- Farmhouse and barn-inspired builds gain from taller, up and down oriented lites. Take into consideration carriage-house panels with real or fake band joints, paired with clear or satin-etched glass. Keep the equipment subtle so it matches, not completes, with the windows.

Most manufacturers use the exact same window pattern throughout multiple door collection, however the framework percentages alter as panel elevations change. Placement and proportion that flatter the facade
