During remote programming, a technician identifies the opener model, locates the learn button, places the opener into programming mode, and tests the remote from several locations. The process may vary among

brands and generations. A universal remote is not automatically compatible with every garage door opener, especially older systems or openers with proprietary frequencies.

If the learn button does not respond, the receiver or logic board may be defective. In that situation, repeated programming attempts will not correct the fault.
