A virtual coin is turned, and the winner takes the whole pot. 50/50 odds, minus a small platform commission (rake). **Jackpot** Several gamers contribute skins to a central pot. Each skin's worth identifies the player's "ticket" share. A spinner chooses one winner who takes everything. Based on the total worth contributed; platform takes a portion charge.
