2. Recoil Case

The **Recoil Case** was introduced late in CS: GO's active lifecycle, however it quickly ended up being a fan favorite due to its high-tier weapon selections.

- **Standout Skins:** AWP|Neo-Noir, USP-S|Printstream.
- **Why it's great:** The inclusion of the Printstream surface for the USP-S (and its existing appeal on the M4A1-S and Desert Eagle) drove enormous demand. In addition, the lower-tier skins like the AK-47|Head Shot keep solid market price.

3. Prisma 2 Case

For players chasing after vibrant, anime-inspired, or lively sci-fi looks, the **Prisma 2 Case** is a leading contender.

- **Standout Skins:** M4A1-S|Gamer Two, AK-47|Phantom Disruptor.
- **Why it's terrific:** The M4A1-S|Player Two is a fan-favorite amongst players who prefer spirited, dynamic styles over military-sim aesthetic appeals. Paired with Horizon-series knives, it provides a fantastic balance of price and visual appeal.

4. Operation Broken Fang Case

Operations constantly present renowned cases, and **Broken Fang** sticks out due to its addition of representative skins (at the time) and high-demand weapon finishes.

- **Standout Skins:** M4A4|Cyber Security, AWP|Exoskeleton.
- **Why it's excellent:** This case features the specialized glove pool instead of standard knives. Gloves like Driver Gloves|Snow Leopard and Specialist Gloves|Marble Fade remain some of the most sought-after products in the video game, keeping the worth of this case steadily climbing.

5. CS20 Case

Launched to commemorate the 20th anniversary of the Counter-Strike franchise, the **CS20 Case** relies heavily on fond memories while presenting a new knife type.



- **Standout Skins:** AWP|Wildfire, FAMAS|Commemoration.
- **Why it's great:** The introduction of the *Classic Knife* (a nod to the initial Counter-Strike 1.6 knife) makes opening this case a classic experience. The weapon skins pay tribute to traditional map themes, making them instantaneous classics for veteran gamers.
