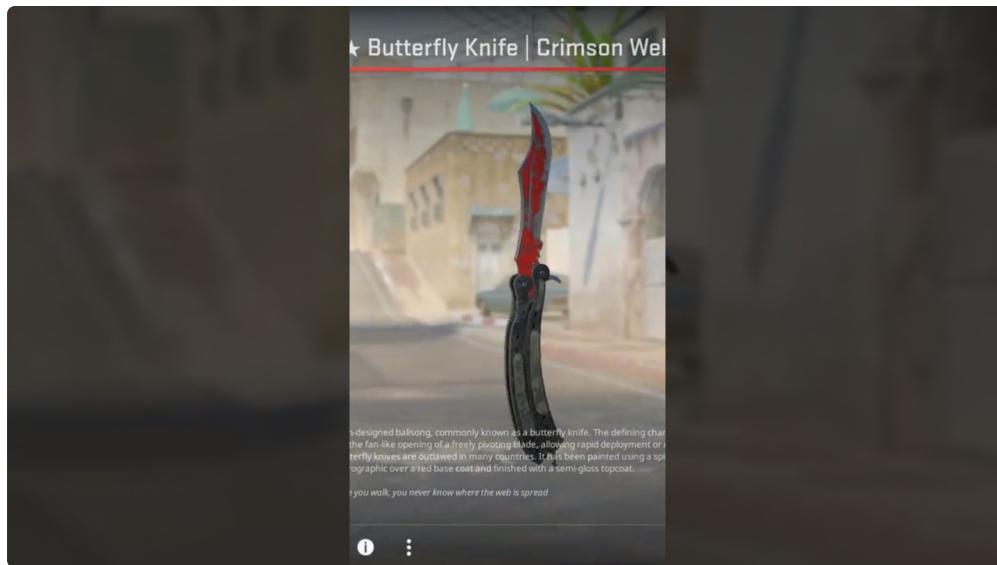

### 3. Drop Rates and Probabilities

The official drop possibilities (as released by Valve) for each rarity in a standard CS2 case are:

| Rarity                   | Approximate Drop Rate |
|--------------------------|-----------------------|
| Mil-Spec (Blue)          | 79.92%                |
| Restricted (Purple)      | 15.98%                |
| Classified (Pink)        | 3.20%                 |
| Covert (Red)             | 0.64%                 |
| Rare Special Item (Gold) | -- Knife <b>0.25%</b> |

Thus, on average, **1 out of every 400 openings** yields a knife (or glove) skin. The exact knife design (e.g., Bayonet vs. Karambit) is selected from a swimming pool of available knives for that case, each similarly likely within the Rare Special Item tier.

### 4. Typical Knives and Market Values

Below is a list of the most sought-after knives, together with their typical market value (since early 2026). Prices can vary considerably based on float, stattrak, and stage.

**Pointer:** Float values below 0.02 (Factory New) frequently command a 30-50% premium over battle-scarred equivalents.

#### 5.1. Set a Budget

- **Choose in advance** just how much you want to invest on secrets, and stick to that limitation.
- Treat the purchase as home entertainment, not an investment.

## 5.2. Pick the Right Case

- **Operation Broken Fang** and **Revolution** cases tend to have greater typical knife worth returns, however they are also more expensive per key.
- If you want a particular knife (e.g., Karambit), target the case that includes it.

## 5.3. Display Market Trends

- Usage third-party trackers (e.g., CS2Stash, Buff163) to see price fluctuations.
- Purchasing a case when the marketplace is filled can decrease the resale price of the resulting skin.

## 5.4. Utilize Promotions

- Throughout significant sales (e.g., Steam Summer Sale) keys might be discounted.
- Some third-party sites use "totally free" day-to-day cases-- use them to increase opening volume without additional expense.

- In numerous jurisdictions, opening loot boxes is restricted for minors. Guarantee compliance with regional age policies.
- Prevent grey-market websites that promise "guaranteed" knives; these frequently violate Valve's Terms of Service and can lead to account bans.

**Q: What are the odds of getting a knife from a single case?**A: The official odds are 0.25% ( $\approx 1$  in 400).
