Ants are an additional common issue. They often arrive in spring and early summer as the ground warms and moisture levels fluctuate. Kitchen crumbs, pet food, and damp areas near sinks or basements can lure them. A targeted **ant control** strategy usually includes inspection, sealing **entry points**, and improved sanitation, not just surface sprays.

Wasps become a major issue in late summer, especially near decks, eaves, sheds, and playgrounds. Professional **wasp nest removal** is often the best option, particularly when nests are high, hidden, or aggressively defended.
