For players going after colorful, anime-inspired, or vibrant sci-fi aesthetic appeals, the **Prisma 2 Case** is a top contender.

- **Standout Skins:** M4A1-S|Gamer Two, AK-47|Phantom Disruptor.
- **Why it's terrific:** The M4A1-S|Player Two is a fan-favorite among players who choose lively, vibrant styles over military-sim aesthetics. Coupled with Horizon-series knives, it offers a terrific balance of cost and visual appeal.

4. Operation Broken Fang Case

Operations constantly introduce renowned cases, and **Broken Fang** sticks out due to its addition of agent skins (at the time) and high-demand weapon finishes.

- **Standout Skins:** M4A4|Cyber Security, AWP|Exoskeleton.
- **Why it's great:** This case includes the specialized glove pool instead of basic knives. Gloves like Driver Gloves|Snow Leopard and Specialist Gloves|Marble Fade stay a few of the most sought-after products in the game, keeping the worth of this case progressively climbing.
