- **Verify Trade URLs:** Ensure that the trade URL used on third-party websites comes from the proper account and hasn't been intercepted by malware.

To Open or Not to Open?

Mathematically speaking, opening cases is a losing monetary proposition. Valve programs the drop rates so that the huge bulk of openings result in consumer-grade (blue) weapon skins worth substantially less than the price of the key.

- **Blue Skins (Mil-Spec):** ~ 79.98% opportunity
- **Purple Skins (Restricted):** ~ 15.98% opportunity
- **Pink Skins (Classified):** ~ 3.2% chance
- **Red Skins (Covert):** ~ 0.64% chance
- **Special Rare Item (Knives/Gloves):** ~ 0.26% possibility

Note: Percentages are approximations based on community tracking and information collection.

Finest Practices for Unboxing

1. **Set a Budget:** Treat case opening like home entertainment (like going to a gambling establishment), not as an investment technique.
