1. **Note the Error Message:** Does the video game crash to desktop (CTD) silently, or does it show a specific error code (like engine.dll or memory allowance errors)?
2. **Inspect System Temperatures:** Overheating CPUs and GPUs will instantly throttle or shut down procedures to prevent long-term hardware damage.
3. **Verify Recent Changes:** Did the crash start taking place instantly after a Windows update, a graphics chauffeur update, or the setup of new peripherals?

### Step-by-Step Troubleshooting Solutions

## 1. Confirm Integrity of Game Files

## 3. Change Launch Options

- **Action 1:** Navigate to the video game setup directory (normally C: \ Program Files (x86)\ Steam \ steamapps \ typical \ Counter-Strike Global Offensive).
- **Action 2:** Locate the main executable file (csgo.exe).
- **Step 3:** Right-click the file and choose **Properties**.
- **Step 4:** Go to the **Compatibility** tab.
- **Step 5:** Check package for **Disable fullscreen optimizations**.
- **Action 6:** Click *Apply* and *OKAY*.

## Advanced Troubleshooting

If basic software application repairs stop working to resolve the crashing problem, the issue may lie much deeper within the os or hardware setup.

### Handling Overclocks (CPU, GPU, and RAM)

Many competitive gamers overclock their hardware to eke out every last frame per second (FPS). However, source engines can be notoriously conscious unsteady overlocks.

- If the system has an aggressive CPU or GPU overclock applied by means of MSI Afterburner or the BIOS, go back the clock speeds back to factory stock settings to test stability.
- **XMP/EXPO Profiles:** Unstable RAM profiles can trigger unexpected game crashes and memory checked out mistakes. Try disabling XMP/DOCP in the BIOS briefly to see if crashes persist.

### Running as Administrator

Permissions concerns can occasionally avoid the game from writing required cache files to the storage drive.

- Find csgo.exe, right-click it, choose **Properties**, go to the **Compatibility** tab, and examine **Run this program as an administrator**.

### Re-installing the Game
