- Type the URL yourself instead of clicking links in emails or messages. For BingoPlus, the official website's domain will typically look like <https://www.bingoplus.com> (note: always verify exact domain spelling).

Using Your *Web Browser* and *Browser Autofill* Safely

Modern web browsers offer convenient features like autofilling your login credentials. While these can reduce errors and typos, it's important to know when and how to use them safely.

- **Browser autofill** official domain only. Double-check the address bar before accepting autofill suggestions.
- If your browser warns that a page's certificate is invalid or that the connection is not secure, *do not* use autofill or enter credentials manually.
- If you notice unexpected prompts or fields on a page, close the tab and navigate to the official BingoPlus site manually.

Why Not Just "Reset Your Password" Every Time You Have Trouble?

While support help articles often say, “just reset your password” when login fails, this advice is too vague and sometimes unhelpful. Different errors have different causes:



Issue	Likely Cause	Recommended Fix
Cannot enter password or page won't submit	Browser issue, expired session, or incorrect domain	Clear cookies/cache, confirm official domain & HTTPS, retry in fresh tab

Resetting your password is important but should be a last resort after confirming basic troubleshooting steps.

Understanding OTP and Verification Code Privacy Rules

One-time passwords (OTPs) are designed to add an extra layer of security by verifying your possession of a trusted device or phone number. To keep your BingoPlus account safe, follow these important privacy rules:

1. **Never share your OTP with anyone.** Legitimate support staff or companies *will never* ask you to provide your OTP over the phone, email, or chat.
2. **Never enter your OTP on websites or apps other than the official BingoPlus login screen.** Phishing sites often ask for OTPs to bypass phone verification.
3. **Do not screenshot or save your OTP code together with other personal info.** Screenshots can be stolen or accidentally shared on social platforms.
4. **Be mindful of OTP expiry.** OTPs often expire quickly (under 5 minutes). If your OTP is expired, request a new one instead of attempting multiple entries.

What Does a *Confirmed Secure Account Screen* Look Like?

When logging in to BingoPlus, <https://dpwishes.in/how-bingoplus-is-improving-account-recovery-experience/> a **confirmed secure account screen** is your visual assurance that you're in the right place. It typically includes:



- The website's correct hostname displayed in the browser address bar (e.g., <https://www.bingoplus.com>)
- An HTTPS padlock icon showing encrypted connection
- Clear branding and UI consistent with BingoPlus's official look and feel
- Secure input fields for the password and OTP that do not prompt you to download suspicious software or share codes outside the page

If any of these are missing or look suspicious, close the tab immediately and try again using a trusted bookmark or typing the URL yourself.

What About Third-Party Sites Like dpwishes.in?

Some users might come across domains like dpwishes.in in emails or promotions related to BingoPlus. While these could be promotional or affiliate sites, they are *not* the secure login portal for BingoPlus.

Important: Never enter your password or OTP on third-party sites unless explicitly confirmed by BingoPlus's official communications. Instead, navigate directly to the official BingoPlus domain in your browser to login.
