Prevent petroleum-based lubes(like WD-40 for basic usage)because they draw in dust and gunk, making the problem worse with time. 3. **Hinge and Frame Inspection(For**
- **Hinged/Bi-Fold Doors)** **For French doors or bi-fold glazed systems, the weight of the glass puts substantial stress on the**
- **hinges. Examine for sagging. If the door scrapes versus the floor or frame, the hinges likely need modification utilizing an Allen wrench. Tighten any loose screws on the hinges and** manages. Wipe down aluminum, uPVC, or wooden frames with a wet cloth and moderate cleaning agent. 4. **Weatherstripping and Seal Checks** Drafts around a glazed door indicate stopping working weatherstripping.
