Binding Estimate

Guarantees the total cost based on the inventory list. You won't pay more even if the actual weight exceeds the estimate, but you'll pay the quoted amount regardless of actual weight.

Non-Binding Estimate

Provides an approximate cost based on expected weight. The final price is calculated after weighing your shipment, which could be higher or lower than the estimate.

Binding Not-to-Exceed Estimate

You pay the quoted amount if your shipment weighs less than expected, or the actual weight-based price if it's more. This offers the best protection against unexpected costs.

Best Practice: Always request a binding not-to-exceed estimate for maximum cost certainty and potential savings.
