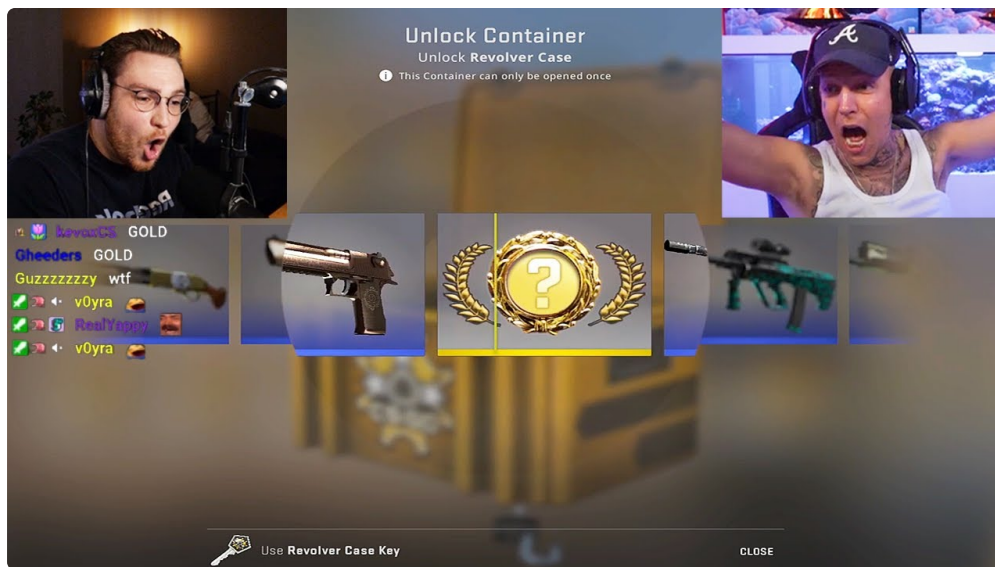

3. Mental Tactics
