Popular Games Found on CS: GO Casino Sites

1. Roulette

A simple 1v1 game mode. 2 players wager skins of roughly equivalent worth. The system designates one player "Terrorist" and the other "Counter-Terrorist," flips a virtual coin, and the winner takes the entire pot (minus a small site commission, known as the rake).

4. Jackpot

Multiple players throw skins into a typical pot. The worth of each player's skins identifies their percentage possibility of winning the whole pool. A virtual spinner selects the winner, suggesting a player who deposited a low-value skin still has a possibility-- albeit a little one-- to win whatever.

- Traditional fiat payment approaches (Credit/Debit cards, e-wallets like Skrill or Neteller)
