What Role Does Thermal Imaging Play in Documenting Contamination Type?

Thermal imaging cameras detect moisture presence by measuring temperature variations invisible to the human eye. 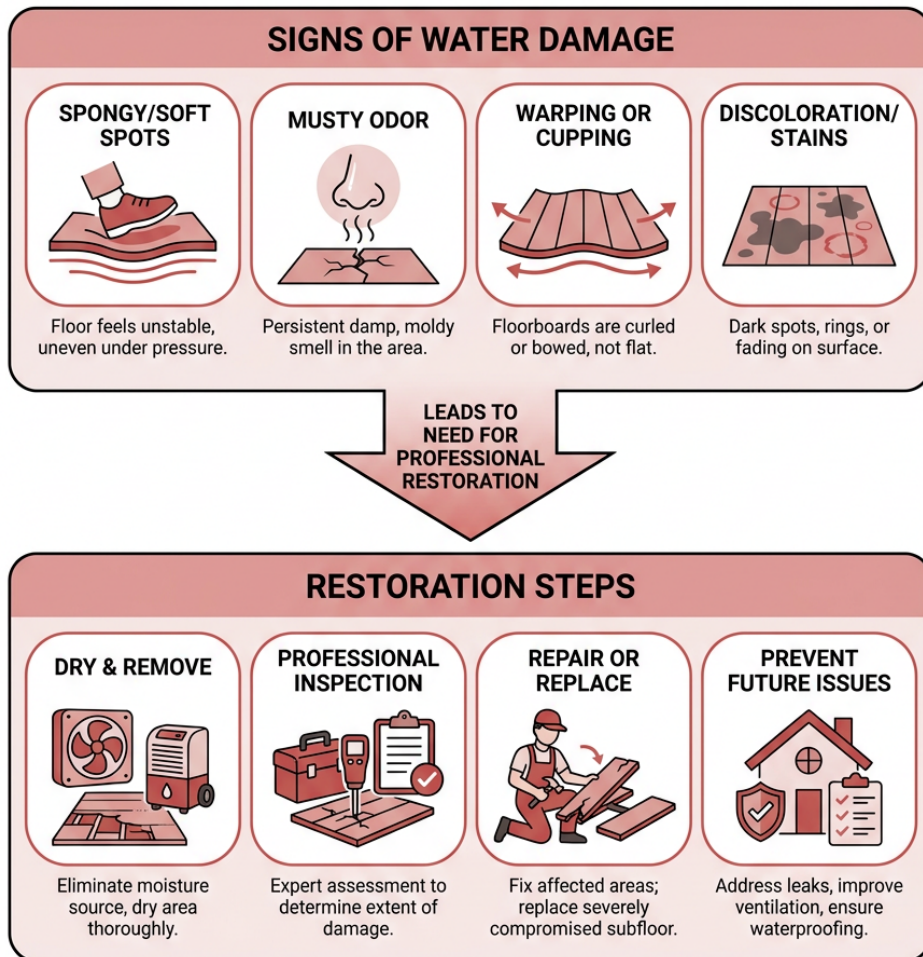
