

Garage doors are substantial, intricate systems that combine panels, springs, cables, rollers, tracks, and an automatic opener. A problem that appears minor, such as a loud garage door or a door that travels unevenly, can turn into a serious safety issue if it is ignored. Never remove or adjust torsion springs, extension springs, cables, drums, bottom brackets, or other components that store substantial energy. Do not stand beneath a partially supported door or use the opener to compensate for a broken spring. These tasks require specialized tools and knowledge of **garage door safety**.

The **manual release** can separate the opener so the door can be moved by hand, but use it only when the door is completely closed and stable unless a professional gives specific instructions. After any opener work, test the reversal function and photo-eye sensors according to the manufacturer's instructions.

If the door is trapped open, a vehicle is trapped inside, or a broken component creates a security or weather problem, call for **emergency garage door repair**. Keep people and pets away from the opening until the system is made safe.

How Can Los Angeles Homeowners Reduce the Risk of Garage Door Damage?

Regular **garage door maintenance** can detect worn components before they fail. A garage door maintenance service can inspect balance, springs, cables, rollers, hinges, tracks, opener force, fasteners, and safety reversal. Follow the manufacturer's recommendations, but many residential systems are best served by a professional inspection at least annually and sooner when the door is used heavily.
