

A broken garage door spring can leave your residential overhead garage door immobile, heavy to operate, or hazardous to use. In Los Angeles, homeowners may need specific service considerations depending on whether they live in the city, Pasadena, Long Beach, Santa Monica, or the San Fernando Valley. Travel distance, door age, coastal exposure, and the condition of related hardware can all influence the repair process.

If a Garage Door Spring Should Be Replaced

An **extension spring** is installed along the horizontal tracks on either side of the door. It stretches and contracts as the door opens and closes. Extension spring systems commonly include safety cables because a failed spring can dislodge or separate unexpectedly.

Signs of a **broken garage door spring** include a visible gap in the coil, a loud snapping sound, a door that will not open, or a door that opens only a few inches before stopping. You may also notice that the door feels unusually heavy when disconnected from the opener. Rust, stretched coils, unusual noise, and an uneven door can indicate that replacement is becoming necessary even if the spring has not completely failed.

Do not continue operating the door if it is misaligned, dropping abruptly, or supported by only one spring. Repeated use can damage the garage door opener, cables, rollers, and tracks.

Garage door safety depends on various parts functioning together. Springs contain significant energy, and the stored **spring tension** can cause serious injury if a spring, winding component, or cable is handled improperly. A spring may seem basic, but identifying, removing, and fitting the correct part requires professional tools and proper methods.

Garage door cables are also essential to safety. They help lift and stabilize the door, particularly on torsion spring systems. If a cable has come off a drum, developed fraying, or become loose, the door can become uneven. A professional should check the cables before putting a new spring under tension.

Never attempt to cut, loosen, tighten, or unwind a torsion spring with household tools. Extension springs also present dangers if they are removed without properly securing the system. Keep children, pets, and vehicles away from a damaged door until it has been evaluated.

A **professional garage door technician** can protect the door, confirm the spring type and size, test the balance, and inspect the full lifting system. For a torsion spring system, the technician secures the door and services the spring assembly mounted on the **spring tube**. The existing spring is carefully released before it is removed. The replacement is determined based on measured requirements rather than color alone.

The technician fits the spring, bearing components, drums, and cables as required. The **winding hardware** are then set with proper winding bars according to the door's requirements. This is a carefully controlled process because improper winding can make the door unsafe or cause early breakdown.

For an extension spring system, the technician inspects the springs, pulleys, containment cables, and track alignment. Damaged or missing safety cables should be repaired before the system is put back into operation.

After installation, the technician reconnects and tests the opener, safety reversal system, travel limits, and manual operation. The door should move smoothly, remain reasonably balanced, and respond correctly by stopping or reversing during safety testing. The technician should also outline recommended garage door maintenance.

Should You Fix or Change the Entire Garage Door?

A failed spring alone usually does not mean the entire door needs replacement. If the panels are sound, the tracks are aligned, and the opener is reliable, spring replacement may return safe operation at a lower cost than a complete replacement.
