4. Coinflip

A traditional 1v1 game of possibility. 2 gamers wager skins of roughly equal value. The system designates one player as Heads and the other as Tails, then flips a virtual coin. The winner takes the whole pot, minus a little platform commission (rake).

5. Esports Match Betting

For fans of the expert scene (BLAST Premier, ESL Pro League, Majors), match betting is the go-to option. Users bet on professional teams using chances determined by the platform, comparable to standard sportsbooks.
