Therx's interface traditionally emphasizes a forum-style gathering of picks and discussion over tight line shopping tools. Opening prices and line histories aren't always front-and-center or easy to digest. That means you may miss crucial market intel that would help you place smarter bets.

However, if you're allergic to "anonymous five-star picks" with no track record or pushy "signup-to-see-insider-tips" pop-ups—both pet peeves of mine—Therx's community-driven environment can be a breath of fresh air.
