Drop Pools Explained

The case drop pool is divided into 2 unique categories:

1. **Active Drop Pool:** Cases presently dropping actively to gamers who play the game. When Valve launches a brand-new case, an older active case is typically transferred to the unusual drop swimming pool.
2. **Unusual Drop Pool:** Cases that no longer drop often. They have an extremely low opportunity (approximated at around 1%) of dropping to gamers at the end of a match. Since of their deficiency, these cases frequently appreciate in worth in time.

3. CS2 Case Drop Rates and Rarities

Whenever a player opens a CS2 case, a server-side random number generator (RNG) determines the result. Valve is transparent about the relative rarity tiers of the items inside, though the specific item within a tier is evenly random.



Rarity Tier Approximate Drop Rate Description **Mil-Spec (Blue)** ~ 79.92% The most typical products in any case. Normally worth pennies. **Limited (Purple)** ~ 15.98% Uncommon skins with somewhat more complex designs. **Categorized (Pink)** ~ 3.20% Rare weapon surfaces, typically forming the bulk of a case's value. **Covert (Red)** ~ 0.64% The greatest basic weapon tier. Highly popular. **Special Rare (Gold)** ~ 0.26% Knives or Gloves. The holy grail of case opening.

*Note: There is likewise an approximately 10% possibility for any weapon skin dropped to be in **StatTrak**™ condition, which tracks eliminates made with that weapon.*

4. Float Values and Exterior Conditions

Unboxing a skin is just half the fight; the physical condition of the product drastically impacts its value. CS2 uses a **Float Value** system, varying from **0.00 to 1.00**, to figure out wear and tear.

- **Factory New (FN):** 0.00-- 0.07 (Immaculate, minimal scratches)
- **Minimal Wear (MW):** 0.07-- 0.15 (Slight imperfections)
- **Field-Tested (FEET):** 0.15-- 0.38 (Noticeable wear, scratches)
- **Well-Worn (WW):** 0.38-- 0.45 (Significant wear)
- **Battle-Scarred (BS):** 0.45-- 1.00 (Heavy damage, sometimes exposing special patinas)

Some skins look almost identical in Field-Tested as they carry out in Factory New, while others look heavily degraded. Smart traders and collectors pay close attention to drift caps when assessing case pulls.

For many years, lots of cases have been released. Some have become legendary due to their contents or investment capacity.

- **The CS: GO Weapon Case:** The initial case that started the skin economy. Extremely unusual and pricey.
