

What garage door concerns require qualified attention?

An overhead garage door is a heavy mechanical system that depends on balanced springs, lifting cables, rollers, tracks, hinges, and an operating mechanism. If the opener runs but the door does not move, the drive gear, trolley, chain, belt, or connection between the opener and door may be damaged. Do not repeatedly operate a door that is crooked, grinding, or stuck halfway; continued use can increase the problem.

When can a broken garage door spring pose a danger?

A broken garage door spring is dangerous because the springs help support the garage door weight. A torsion spring is positioned above the door, while an extension spring is typically positioned along the horizontal tracks. Both store substantial energy, even when the door looks still.

Signs of spring failure include a visible gap in the spring, a loose or dangling component, a door that feels extremely heavy, loud snapping sounds, or a door that rises only a few inches. Lifting cables may also come loose when a spring fails. Never attempt to unwind, or reconnect a spring without specialized training and tools.

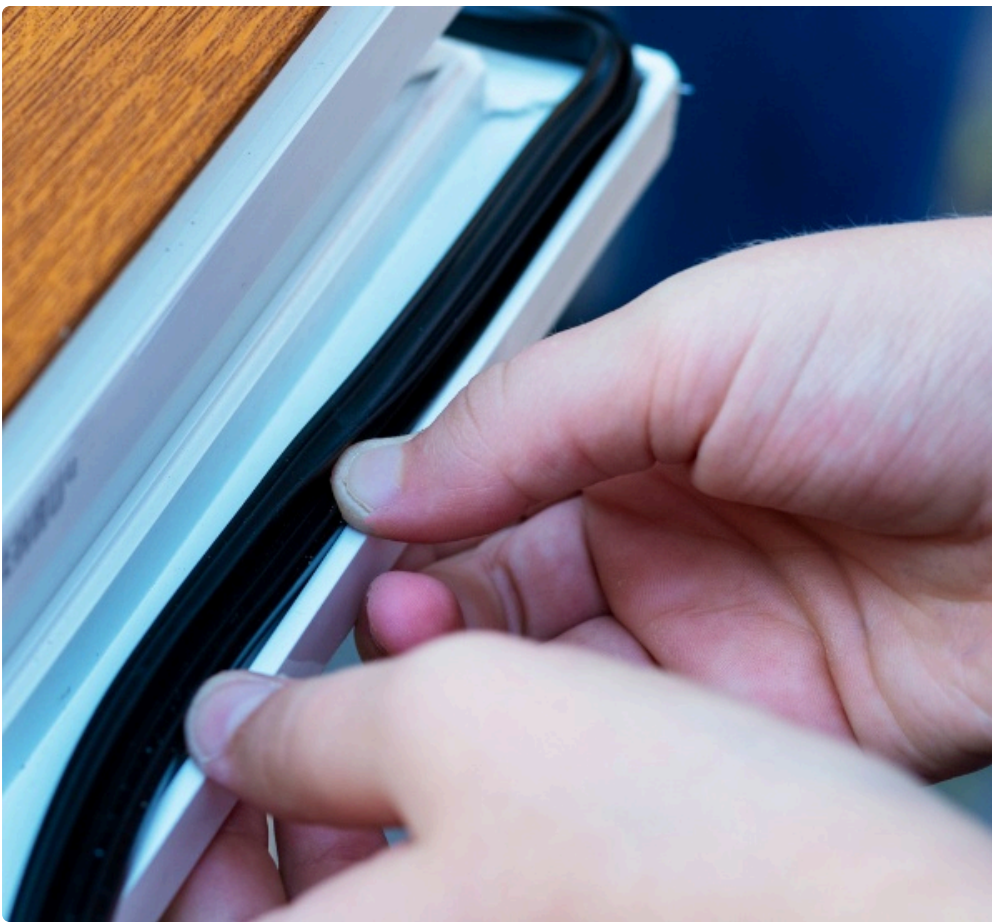
Do not operate a door with a crushed lower section, separated hinges, or a visibly damaged frame. The panel may shift under load and place extra stress on the opener or lifting cables.
