Popular Games Found on CS2 Gambling Platforms

Common Game Modes

- **Crash:** A multiplier starts at 1.0 x and climbs up quickly. Gamers must squander before the multiplier "crashes." If it crashes before they cash out, they lose their bet.

- **Case Opening:** Simulates the in-game case-opening mechanic, typically with tailored chances and higher-tier skin pools.
- **Jackpot:** Multiple players deposit skins into a single pot. The greater the value of a gamer's deposit, the higher their statistical possibility of winning the entire collected pot.
- **Esports Betting:** Wagering on expert CS2 matches (e.g., ESL Pro League, Majors) utilizing virtual balance or skins, anticipating match winners, map ratings, or particular in-game occasions.
