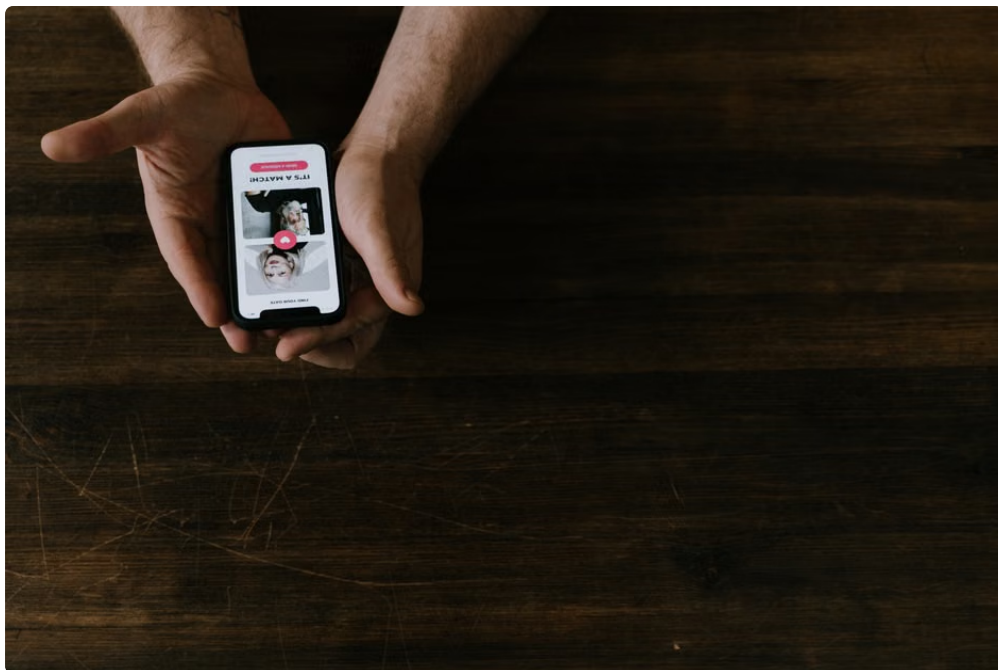
This level of transparency helps players make informed decisions daily, reduces frustration caused by unexpected payment declines, and supports safer play.
