Repairing Checklist: How to Fix CS2 Crashes

If CS2 is disrupting your matches, resolving a structured troubleshooting procedure is the most efficient method to find a fix.

1. Confirm Game File Integrity

Over time, video game files can become corrupted due to interrupted updates or unexpected system shutdowns.

- Open Steam and browse to your **Library**.
- Right-click **Counter-Strike 2** and select **Properties**.
- Go to the **Installed Files** tab and click **Verify stability of game files**.
- Allow Steam to scan and replace any missing or damaged files.

2. Update Graphics Drivers

Source 2 is greatly optimized for modern-day GPU architectures, but it needs updated motorists to prevent memory leakages and crashes.

- **NVIDIA Users:** Open GeForce Experience or download the most recent Game Ready Driver directly from the website.
- **AMD Users:** Use AMD Software: Adrenalin Edition to bring the current WHQL-certified driver.

3. Change In-Game Video Settings

- Disable **FidelityFX Super Resolution (FSR)** if it triggers instability.

4. Handle Overlays and Background Applications

- Discord Overlay
